Our annual Book Sale will open for its 56th year on Saturday, September 9. Our hours have changed to 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Saturdays, and 10:00 a.m. to Noon on Thursdays, to better accommodate our customers. Sales and donations are accepted and welcome on both days. We are still located in the basement of the Old First Church, Kings Highway, in Middletown.

We have a wonderful selection of paperback (\$3.00) and hardcover (\$4.00) books for every reader, from preschool to adult. Books for children start at 25¢. In addition, we have received numerous donations of DVDs (50¢), CDs (25¢), books on tape, and vinyl records (50¢), as well as games and puzzles. We have a great selection

of fiction as well as a variety of nonfiction - biographies, history, sports, DIY, etc. As you know, the net proceeds from the sale help to provide scholarships for women at Monmouth University and Brookdale Community College as well as programs supported by AAUW for women and girls.

Our group enables women with a good knowledge of French to maintain their fluency through language structure reviews and conversations with other members on different topics.




