benefit from the funds raised there to support scholarships and special projects for women and girls.



#### **PUBLIC POLICY**

The first week of October is National Voter Education Week. And we are doing our part with our October 2 program at Brookdale Community College. We will be sharing the nonpartisan AAUW 2024 Voter Issue Guide, which explains

AAUW positions on nine public policy priorities that support gender equity. You can download it in <a href="English">English</a> or <a href="Spanish">Spanish</a>, share with friends and family, and encourage them to vote! While the upcoming election is holding much of our attention, important work lies ahead! For example, in the September newsletter, CEO Gloria Blackwell notes that the gender pay gap has widened:

Women working full-time now earn just 83% of what men earn, a decline from last year's 84%. This amounts to a loss of \$11,550 annually for each full-time working woman.

While there have been gains in real earnings for both men and women, women, especially women of color, continue to be pushed into lower wage jobs. . . We must address the systemic barriers that keep women from earning their fair share – like the lack of paid leave, affordable childcare, and strong pay equity laws.

As we move forward this fall, let's channel our collective energy. Whether it's by joining <a href="Two-Minute Activist">Two-Minute Activist</a>, voting for candidates that support women's issues, or standing up against injustice wherever you can, each of us has a role to play in creating a more equitable world.

Tax-Smart Giving: And, of course, our donations would help support the AAUW mission. You are invited to explore tax-smart giving options that can help empower women and girls while also reducing your tax burden. If you own stock or cryptocurrency, or have an IRA or a Donor-Advised Fund (DAF), you can learn more here.

Women's Economic Empowerment Webinars: Whether you're a student stepping into the professional world, currently in the workforce, or a higher ed staff or faculty member (who can share the webinars), our salary negotiation and financial literacy sessions are curated to offer valuable insights and tools for every career stage. See the schedule here. Applications for Fellowships and Grants Now Open: It's that time of year—applications for fellowships and grants are now open for the 2025-26 academic year. Thanks to your dedicated support, AAUW continues to impact the lives of women scholars and community organizations focused of equity for women and girls. Please share with your networks.

If anyone is interested in joining the group, please contact the chair for further information. Newcomers are always welcome.



## Barbara Withers's Other Talent on Full Display

We all know and admire Barbara for her talent as a program organizer, meeting and membership planner, and otherwise indispensable member of our branch. Some of us also know her as a talented photographer. Those who do – and those who don't – should head on over to the lobby of the Atrium between now and the end of November to see her current show. It's really quite remarkable, especially when hearing some of Barbara's stories about how she got these shots – most, by the way, taken on an iPhone and many printed on canvas.

Most striking when a friend and I arrived on its opening afternoon was a picture of a fractured building, or so it appears – it's actually the façade of an aging one reflected in the glass of another, quite modern one. My first thought was of a digital puzzle; inspection demonstrates otherwise. Mounted next to it are three others -- all emphasizing the geometry of several new structures, aiming aloft against a brilliantly blue sky. Barbara says she was on an afternoon tour to Lower Manhattan sponsored by Brookdale Community College. Participants were given 20

minutes to wander on their own – and Barbara's eye not only caught some extraordinary shots, her camera got them as well.



Also in the show are some calendar-worthy photographs of bears, polar and brown; the latter taken on a trip to Alaska. The brown bear portrait, full face, looks as though it was taken from only a few feet away; actually, it was about 15 feet distant. As Barbara explained, he was in one enclosure; she was in another, set up for just this purpose in a manner designed to neither scare nor endanger the bear.

Walking toward the gallery area, I saw what appeared to be a painting of a lighthouse. My initial thought was that someone else had work in the show. But, no, it was indeed a lighthouse, and the process of printing the image on canvas suggests at first glance an acrylic. A few other seaside shots have a similar visual impact. (Catch the sunset!)

Barbara, I think we do all know, is quite a traveler. These shots originated on some of her trips – Manitoba and Maine, as well as Manhattan. You can see them all in the Atrium

lobby, 40 Riverside Dr., in Red Bank, open to visitors all day.
